Assistive Technology for communication are used to help people with communication difficulties express their wants, needs, and ideas to the people around them.



Low Tech - Pencil and paper, marker and white board, picture/object/symbol choices, eye gaze communication board, picture exchange system, sign language



Mid Tech - Talking switches, talking watches, talking battery operated devices with variable messaging levels



High Tech - tablet or smartphone with communication app, stand alone speech generating device, switch access, head tracking, pointer, eye gaze access, direct select, scanning selection
