Assistive Technology for Activities of Daily Living

Assistive Technology for Activities of Daily Living are used to help people with physical limitations or other disabilities perform everyday tasks such as meal preparation, eating and drinking, hygiene/bathing, grooming, dressing, or school/work.



Meal preparation: jar opener, rocker knife, talking timer, no slip cutting board, large handled utensils



Grooming: electric razor, toothpaste dispenser, wide grip nail clipper



Eating/drinking: selfleveling utensils, scooper plates and bowls, spillproof cups, robotic selffeeder



Dressing: button hook/zipper pull, sock aid, magnetic buttons, no tie shoe laces



Hygiene/bathing: long handled scrubber, toilet aid, scalp brush, foot sponge



School/work: page turner, adapted scissors/pencils/pens, one handed keyboard, voice recognition
